Benjamin A. American Councils for International Education (ACTR – ACCELS) – Undergraduates who intend to teach are eligible for full or partial scholarships through American Councils from the U. S. Department of Education (Fulbright-Hays) grant support for their participation in the Russian Language and Area Studies Program or the Eurasian Regional Language Program. To be eligible to apply you must have been offered a place as a study abroad or exchange student in a UK university which is a member of BUTEX (British Transatlantic Exchange Association) for the academic year 2009/2010. Center for Global Education (CGE) – Scholarships are available for students underrepresented in study abroad. Applicants must submit a completed scholarship application, including documentation of current funding. Deadline for spring programs is November 1 and May 1 for fall programs.

CIEE International Study Programs (CIEE-ISP) Scholarships – These scholarships are available for CIEE Study Center applicants from Academic Consortium (AC) member institutions. Awards, applied to program fees, are usually made in amounts of \$2,000 for semester or yearlong programs, and \$1,000 for summer programs.

Robert B. Bailey III Minority Student Scholarships – Awards of \$1,500 for semester or yearlong programs and \$500 for summer programs. Awards are for students traditionally underrepresented in study abroad, especially ethnic minority students. Campus Deadlines: November 1 for spring programs, April 1 for fall programs.

Jennifer Ritzmann Scholarship – Available to students applying to the Council's program in Monteverde, Costa Rica. Awards, applied to program fees, are usually made in amounts of \$1,500 for semester programs.

U.S. Department of Education Scholarship for Programs in China - Available to students participating in Council Study Center Programs at Nanjing University, Peking University, East China Normal University in Shanghai, and National Chengchi University in Taipei. Grant applicants must have completed a minimum of their sophomore year to qualify. Awards vary in amount and are

applied directly to the applicant's CIEE program fee. Past scholarship awards have ranged from \$1000 - \$8,000 for one term.

Denmark International Studies (DIS) – Awarded to students who otherwise could not afford to study in Denmark. DIS scholarships cannot be used to offset any kind of financial aid at your home school. HECUA Scholarship – Up to three \$750 awards will be made each term to students who have worked for social change and whose future goals will be strengthened by a HECUA semester program. Some additional scholarship money is available for January Interim programs. Students must have applied to a HECUA program in order to be eligible.

HECUA Scholarship for Social Justice – HECUA supporters (alumni, founders, current and former board of staff members) have established a new scholarship fund earmarked for first generation college students, students from low-income families, and students of color. During the academic year, two \$1500 scholarships will be awarded to students in the targeted groups who are enrolling in HECUA semester programs. The application to the scholarship fund is due on the same date as the application for the semester program to which the student is seeking admittance. IIE Nancy Petry Scholarship- One award of \$5,000 will be awarded for the 2009-2010 academic year. Students are not restricted to certain countries or fields of study although the committee encourages applicants in the fields of environmental studies, international business, or economics. Students should demonstrate some proficiency with the language of their chosen country if the program proposed is for a non-English speaking country.

Adell & Hancock Fund- The purpose of the Adell & Hancock Fund is to provide supplemental support to U.S. and international students who are in need of additional funds to carry out their international educational plans for either the summer or fall 2009 semester/term. The amount awarded will depend on individual need as determined by IIE/RMRC scholarship committee to not exceed \$2,400 per candidate. IIE will award two grants in 2009.
