

Assistant Professor of Anatomy and Physiology — Health and Exercise Science

Gustavus Adolphus College invites applications for a tenure-track position of Assistant Professor of Anatomy and Physiology in the Department of Health and Exercise Science to begin September 1, 2010.

We seek candidates who have an earned doctorate by August 2010 in Exercise Science or related fields with emphasis in human anatomy and physiology. The successful candidate should have prior experience teaching anatomy and physiology. Previous academic experience with diverse populations is highly desirable.

Primary responsibilities will include teaching Human Anatomy and Physiology lectures, First Term Seminar, and a January Term. Opportunities to teach other Health and Exercise Science courses such as nutrition or biomechanics will be based on the candidate's experience and expertise. The successful candidate will also coordinate enrollment and laboratory courses for Anatomy and Physiology, and advise pre Physical Therapy and Occupational Therapy students. A commitment to teaching and advising is essential.

Other responsibilities will include participation on college and departmental committees. The successful candidate will be engaged in scholarly work and facilitate faculty-student research within the department.
