GUSTAVUS INSIDE ATHLETICS

Hagemeyer, Amundson lead the Gusties -

The Gustavus men's swimming and diving team registered a total of 19 top-eight relay finishes last weekend in the Minnesota Challenge at the University of Minnesota Aquatic Center. Scott Hagemeyer and Brian Amundson teamed up on four of five relays and contributed to winning the 400 medley relay (3:36.61) and 400 freestyle relay (3:11.26). Hagemeyer and Amundson also participated in two second-place finishes, including the 200 medley relay (1:38.66) and the 200 freestyle relay (1:24.45). Amundson also swam as part of the winning 800 freestyle relay team with a time of 7:03.99. Gustavus' time in the 200 freestyle relay bettered the "B" national qualifying time of 1:24.90.

Women's Hockey Finishes with Win -

Coach Mike Carroll's squad ended its East coast road trip with a come-from-behind 3-2 victory over Williams College on Saturday. The Gusties lost to then-#2 Plattsburgh State 3-2 on Thursday and were blanked by then-#1 Middlebury College 3-0 on Friday. In the two losses, Gustavus was unable to convert on nine power play opportunities. The Gusties are ranked fourth in the USCHO.com poll as of February 6.

Women's Basketball Secures Playoff

Berth - Gustavus, which is 14-5 overall and 12-4 in the MIAC, secured a berth in the MIAC playoffs with a 72-37 home win Saturday against Saint Mary's. The Gusties have qualified for an MIAC playoff spot six consecutive times. Saint Ben's and Concordia have also clinched conference playoff positions with five games remaining in the MIAC schedule.

TeBrake on the Move - Gustavus senior men's basketball wing Adam TeBrake is currently in ninth place on the all-time assists list with 93. He needs only five to move into the top five. TeBrake also needs 79 points to reach the 1000-point milestone.

NOTABLE PERFORMERS



Loren Collins, a senior tennis player from Dallas, TX, won five of his six matches during Gustavus' touring week trip to Hawaii. Collins won two of his three singles matches and all three doubles matches with junior teammate Jesse

Brauer. His only loss was to Sascha Heineemann from the University of Hawaii (Division I).



Sari Lindeman, a sophomore track athlete from Cannon Falls, MN, set a new indoor track and field record Saturday in the triple jump with a leap of 36 feet, 5 3/4 inches. Her jump broke the previous record of 35 feet, 9 3/4 inches set by Lindsey Weis in 2002. Lindeman

also recorded a thirteenth-place finish in the long jump with a distance of 5.07 meters.



Laura Hansen, a first-year gymnast from Inver Grove Heights, MN, placed third on the uneven bars with a score of 9.00 and seventh on the balance beam with an 8.90. Hansen's efforts helped Gustavus finish third with a season-high score of 172.00 at the Gershon Invitational hosted by the University of Wisconsin at La Crosse. Both scores Friday were career highs for Hansen.



Jered Hokenson, a junior high jumper from Watertown, MN, set a new school record Saturday in the high jump with a height of 6 feet, five inches. Hokenson's jump came as part of the Indoor Pentathlon. His school record jump put him in a tie for third place

in the pentathlon and Hokenson finished sixth overall in the event with 3,099 points.

Men's Basketball - Coach Mark Hanson's squad will play three important MIAC games this week. The Gusties (9-6 MIAC) will play at Bethel (8-7) on Monday, at Saint Olaf (7-9) on Wednesday, and at home on Saturday against Augsburg (2-13). The Gusties are tied for third place with St. John's in the MIAC.
