<u>Please note</u>: Post-Baccalaureate (Post-bacc) students do not complete clinical practicum unless accepted into our graduate program. A clinical practicum experience may be required as early as summer immediately following admission. Post-baccs should review their undergraduate coursework to determine if they have met ASHA basic science requirements by completing a course in *human biology, a course in chemistry or physics, a Statistics course and a course in social or behavioral sciences.*

Acceptance into graduate school for speech-language pathology is competitive.
