- Study hard and take pre-requisite courses
- Maintain good grades and high GPA
- Gain experience
 - Shadowing (two-hours to one day opportunities)
 - January Career Exploration (one month full-time)
 - Research
 - Semester Internships
 - Summer enrichment programs/research programs
 - Volunteer work
 - Experience (EMT, CNA, health services, etc.)

First Year Pre-Health @ Gustavus

- Pre-requisite required coursework
- Do well in ALL classes, establish high GPA
- January Interim course (choose elective or look at research course)
- Gain some experience with a two hour to one day shadow experience, informational interview, research pre-health career area
- Complete the U of M FREE short course on Planning for Medical School
- Join the Gustavus Pre-Health Club or similar organization
- Apply to Summer pre-health enrichment opportunities/ research opportunities

Sophomore Year Pre-Health @ Gustavus

- Pre-requisite required coursework, maintain high GPA
- Start to look at pre-health graduate programs of interest and requirements
- Do a January Interim Career Exploration for Credit
- *Awesome local opportunity for 16 pre-health students; earn credit, 30+ hours health observation for the month of January. Pick up an application in the Career Center (deadline Oct. 19, 2010)
- Volunteer or get involved in something of interest to you and continue during next three years.
- Apply to Summer pre-health enrichment opportunities/ research opportunities

- Study or begin to think about timeline for taking entrance exam (MCAT, GRE, DAT, etc.)
- Letters of Recommendation
- Centralized application will open end of Spring
- Complete the U of M FREE short course on Personal Statements for a Health Profession
- Begin drafting Personal Statement
- Continue to volunteer or participate in activity of interest

Junior Summer Pre-Health @ Gustavus

(if planning to go directly into graduate program)

- Take/study for Entrance Exam
- Finalize Personal Statement
- Complete centralized Application (transcripts, essays, etc.)
- Begin supplemental applications
- Complete the U of M FREE short course on Interviewing Skills for a Health Profession
- Continue to gain pre-health experience

Senior Year Pre-Health @ Gustavus

- Complete final pre-requisite required courses, maintain high GPA
- Research schools prior to interview
- Do a practice interview prior to your first "REAL" interview
- Research and learn more about graduate programs to help narrow decision
- Continue to volunteer or participate in activity of interest
- Make decision about future!
