Explanation of Typical Sanctions

ALCOHOL & DRUG EDUCATION PROGRAMS

<u>Under the Influence, THC 101:</u> These online modules provide basic knowledge, awareness and attitude assessments for students with first time, lower-level alcohol or marijuana offenses. A \$60 course fee is charged.

Choices: A 45-minute alcohol education session facilitated by the Peer Assistants. A \$60 course fee is charged.

Foundations: This program consists of two, 50-minute sessions with a professional. The content utilizes motivational interviewing techniques and interactive journaling to reconnect students with their values and goals, while also providing harm reduction strategies and creating a personal contract for success. A \$75 program fee is charged.

Learn to Live: A customized online program based on the proven principles of Cognitive Behavioral Therapy (CBT). Eight modules are completed over four weeks, followed by a final discussion meeting in person with a Gustavus staff member. Students will learn how to dramatically change their relationship with substances. A \$100 program fee is charged.

<u>Work Hours:</u> Students select or are assigned a work location for completion of hours. A time log is kept and turned in to the Dean's Office when required time is completed.

Mentor Assignment: Students are asked to develop academic, co-curricular and personal goals with the support of a mentor. Students select a mentor from a list of College employees who volunteer with this program. They meet a minimum of four times over the course of six weeks, creating an action plan based on the student's goals.

Meetings with GustieWELL staff or Class Dean:

These staff serve as advisors and accountability partners. Together they build a plan that will support the student as a healthy, successful member of our Gustavus community.

Disciplinary Censure: The nature of the specific violation or existence of prior violations merits concern by the College. Censure serves as an extended period of warning; students sanctioned with Disciplinary Censure should understand that in most cases, future violation will result in Disciplinary Probation.

Disciplinary Probation: The most serious form of behavior-related sanction which can be imposed short of suspension. The individual is considered to be "not in good standing with the Institution" for a determined period of time. Students on Disciplinary Probation will be prohibited from registering for or participating in offcampus study, travel courses, credit-bearing internships, career explorations, and off-campus independent studies. They may be prohibited from representing the College in any activity, performance, or presentation (e.g., athletic teams, fine arts groups, student organizations, etc.).

Suspension: Termination of student status for a definite period of time. The conditions of readmission shall be stated in the order of suspension.

Expulsion: Permanent termination of student status. The fact of expulsion shall become part of the student's permanent academic record at the College and remain so.

Notifications: Parents/guardians are notified when a dependent student of any age is assigned Disciplinary Censure, Probation, Suspension, or Expulsion. Coaches of student athletes are informed when one of their athletes has had any violation of Gustavus alcohol/drug policy. A student's academic advisor is notified when a student is assigned Disciplinary Probation, Suspension, or Expulsion.

Additional options for disciplinary sanctions include but are not limited to: reading and writing assignments, monetary restitution, additional educational programming, residence hall relocation, and referral to additional resources on and/or off campus.

2024-25 Alcohol Violations: Definitions and Minimum Recommended Sanctions

	Level 0 or Concerning Behaviors (first time offenses only, citation*): Promotion of events where alcohol is primary focus; display of alcohol related materials in windows or areas outside of residence hall rooms; possession of open containers in public/nondesignated areas by persons 21 years of age or older. Possession or presence of any alcohol containers in "underage" rooms; possession of alcohol by underage persons. Consumption of alcohol by underage persons including a blood alcohol measure up to .049 as determined by Campus Safety or any law enforcement agency; permitting others (students or guests) to use assigned rooms to violate the alcohol policy.	Level I or Significant Behaviors: Consumption of alcohol by underage persons including a blood alcohol measure between .050 and .149 as determined by Campus Safety or any law enforcement agency, possession/existence of fraudulent identification.	Level II or Serious Behaviors: Staggering: public intoxication, vomiting but coherent and conscious; a blood alcohol measure between .15 and .199 by any student as determined by Campus Safety or any law enforcement agency; students pos- sessing and consuming from kegs or other bulk or common source containers; supply- ing or assisting minors in any way in ob- taining alcohol.	Level III or Dangerous Behaviors: Vomiting and incoherence; unconsciousness; needing or receiving medical attention (including treatment by EMTs and/or transportation to hospital or "detox"); loss of bodily functions; memory loss; BAC .20 or higher by any student (regardless of age) as determined by Campus Safety or any law enforcement agency; illegal sale of alco- hol; driving under the influence.
