Phil Bryant

The 2022 Honors Convocation speaker is Phil Bryant, professor of English and African Studies and winner of the 2021 Edgar M. Carlson Award for Distinguished Teaching, the Gustavus faculty's highest accolade for teaching excellence.

A 1973 graduate of Gustavus, Bryant went on to earn his master's in creative writing from Columbia University before returning to the College as a faculty member in 1989. Since then, he has based his teaching around student-centered discussions that foster genuine learning and connections.

Beyond the classroom, Bryant has authored four books of poetry, most recently *The Promised Land*, which hearkens back to his experience growing up Black on the South Side of Chicago. Today, Bryant uses his position to mentor BIPOC faculty and students, often with a unique blend of wisdom and humor.

The Fulbright Fellowship Program is the largest U.S. exchange program that offers research, study and teaching opportunities in over 140 countries for students and recent graduates. Fulbright aims to increase mutual understanding between people from the U.S. and other countries. English Teaching Assistant Awardees (ETA) teach English in K-12 and college institutions and serve as cultural ambassadors. Applicants submit personal essays and explain their goals in teaching abroad and serving as a cultural ambassador. Final awards are made by embassies in the host country and the Fulbright Foreign Scholarship Board after an interview.

The Barry Goldwater Scholarship and Excellence in Education is a prestigious national scholarship for natural science, engineering and mathematics majors. The Congressional Award is named in honor of Senator Barry Goldwater, who served as a U.S. soldier and politician for 56 years. The scholarship supports college sophomores and juniors who show exceptional promise of becoming this nation's next generation of research leaders. Nominees emerge from a larger pool of candidates in the Gustavus Math and Science Division; a national committee awards scholarships based on an applicant's statements about their commitment and contributions to scientific research. Goldwater alumni can be found conducting research that is helping defend the U.S., finding cures for diseases and teaching future generations of scientists, mathematicians, and engineers.

Truman Scholarship

Abigail P. Doran – Nominee

The Truman Scholarship was established as a living memorial to President Harry Truman to honor the values of service that were a hallmark of his career. The Truman Foundation supports the development of young professionals by funding a graduate degree. The fellowship supports those who have answered the call to become leaders in public service and policy. Gustavus nominates up to four student leaders and a national committee selects and interviews finalists based on their responses on several essays and a policy statement. The Foundation also provides assistance with career counseling, internship placement, graduate school admissions and professional development.

Critical Language Award

The Critical Language Scholarship (CLS) Program is a U.S. government effort to expand the number of Americans studying and mastering critical foreign languages. A scholarship fully-funds intensive language instruction and structured cultural enrichment experiences in countries essential to America's engagement with the world. Applicants must explain their interest in and future application of the critical language. The selected critical languages are: Arabic, Azerbaijani, Bangla, Chinese, Hindi, Indonesian, Japanese, Korean, Persian, Portuguese, Punjabi, Russian, Swahili, Turkish, and Urdu.

Udall Undergraduate Scholarship

Lillian Myra Kingsley – Nominee

The Udall scholarship honors the legacies of Morris and Stewart Udall, whose political careers had a positive impact on the stewardship of public lands and natural resources, and Native American self-governance and health care. The scholarship recognizes sophomores and juniors who excel in leadership, public service, and commitment to the environment or Native American nations. Gustavus nominates up to four students based on their leadership and commitment to environmental issues. The Foundation awards 55 scholarships nationally based on applicants' responses to several essays and a public speech or piece of legislation made by the Udalls. The awardees also participate in a weeklong conference with current and past Udall scholars.

Rossing Physics Scholarship

Dr. Thomas Rossing established The Rossing Fund for Physics Education Endowment which is administered by the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA) for students at ELCA- related colleges or universities. The scholarship awards outstanding sophomore or junior physics students that are nominated by the Gustavus Physics Department. Selection is made by a national committee based on the applicants' personal and research statements.

Public Policy and International Affairs - Junior Summer Institute

Each year, PPIA seeks out high-potential undergraduate students from universities across the country to participate in an intensive seven-week Junior Summer Institute (JSI) before their senior year. During their program, fellows are equipped with the knowledge and skills they will need to succeed in graduate school and ultimately, in influential roles serving the public good.

Schwarzman Scholarship

Schwarzman Scholars are chosen for this highly selective program to live in Beijing for a year of study and cultural immersion and be enrolled in a one-year master's degree in global affairs at Beijing's Tsinghua University.

Scoville Peace Fellowship

The Herbert Scoville Jr. Peace Fellowship was established in 1987 to recruit and train the next generation of policy and advocacy leaders on a range of international peace and security issues in order to inspire creative new approaches to the pervasive challenges to peace and security. Scoville Fellows work full time in Washington, DC at a participating public-interest organization of their choice.


