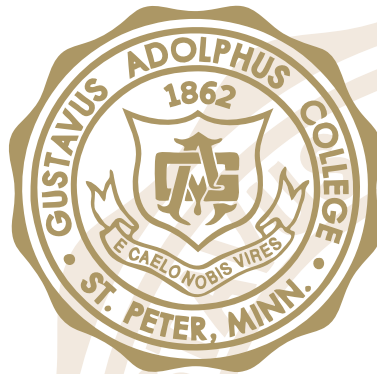
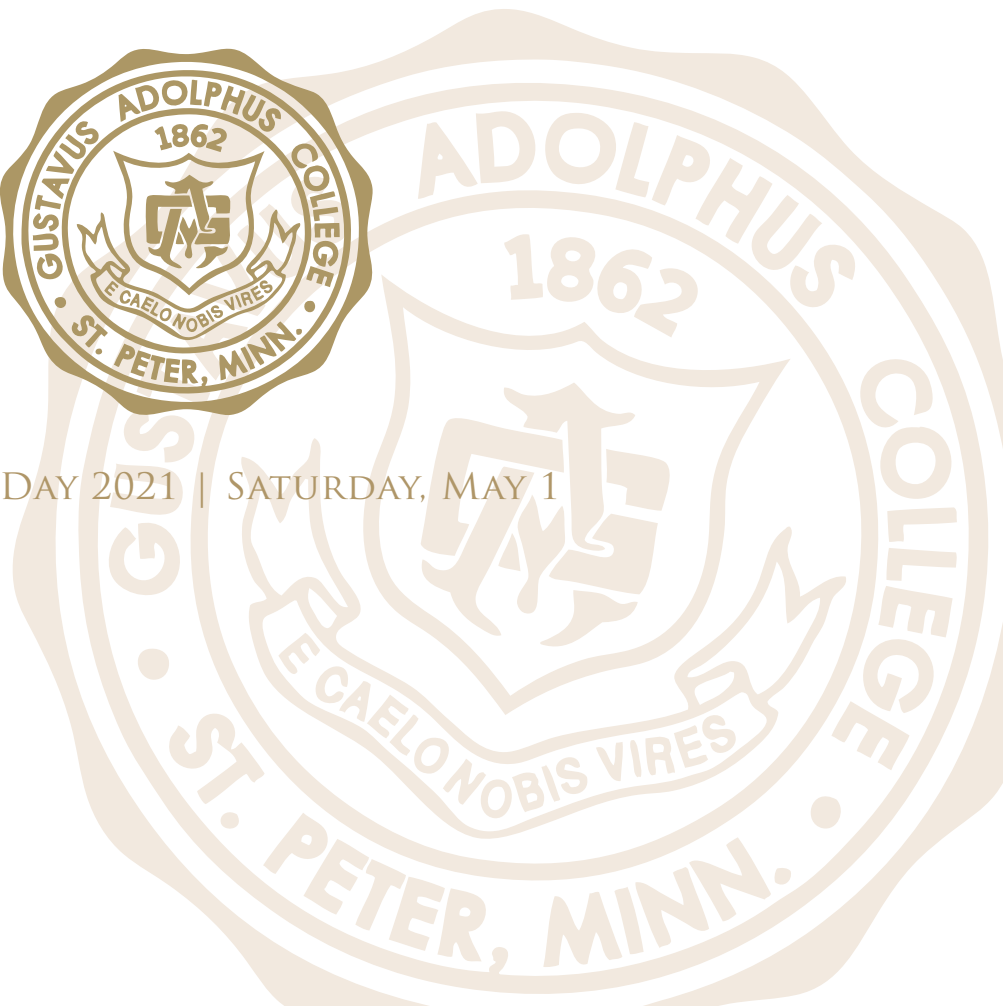

The 2021 Honors Convocation speaker is Margaret Bloch Qazi, associate professor of biology and recipient of the 2019 Edgar M. Carlson Award for Distinguished Teaching, the Gustavus faculty's highest accolade for teaching excellence.

A member of the Gustavus faculty since 2003, Bloch Qazi teaches organismal biology, developmental biology, and entomology in both lecture and laboratory settings. Her research uses techniques and questions from the disciplines of animal behavior, physiology, genetics, development, and evolution to study insect reproductive physiology in the fruit fly (*Drosophila melanogaster*).

Outside of the classroom, Bloch Qazi is currently serving as the John S. Kendall Center for Engaged Learning's Faculty Associate for Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion, a role through which she continually seeks out ways that Gustavus can continue to grow the community in ways that reflect the world's diversity in all forms. Bloch Qazi received a bachelor's degree from Wellesley College and a doctorate from Tufts University.

Phi Beta Kappa is the nation's oldest and most prestigious academic honor society. Students who have excelled in the study of liberal arts are elected each year by a faculty committee of local chapter members. Election criteria include a record of high achievement in liberal arts courses and majors, competency in math and foreign language, and demonstration of a love of learning as evidenced by the depth and breadth of a student's college career. The Gustavus chapter of Phi Beta Kappa, the Eta chapter of Minnesota, was approved in 1982 and formally chartered in April 1983.

The Fulbright Fellowship Program is the largest U.S. exchange program that offers research, study and teaching opportunities in over 140 countries for students and recent graduates. Fulbright aims to increase mutual understanding between people from the U.S. and other countries. English Teaching Assistant Awardees (ETA) teach English in K-12 and college institutions and serve as cultural ambassadors. Applicants submit personal essays and explain their goals in teaching abroad and serving as a cultural ambassador. Final awards are made by embassies in the host country and the Fulbright Foreign Scholarship Board after an interview.

The Barry Goldwater Scholarship and Excellence in Education is a prestigious national scholarship for natural science, engineering and mathematics majors. The Congressional Award is named in honor of Senator Barry Goldwater, who served as a U.S. soldier and politician for 56 years. The scholarship supports college sophomores and juniors who show exceptional promise of becoming this nation's next generation of research leaders. Nominees emerge from a larger pool of candidates in the Gustavus Math and Science Division; a national committee awards scholarships based on an applicant's statements about their commitment and contributions to scientific research. Goldwater alumni can be found conducting research that is helping defend the U.S., finding cures for diseases and teaching future generations of scientists, mathematicians, and engineers.

The Truman Scholarship was established as a living memorial to President Harry Truman to honor the values of service that were a hallmark of his career. The Truman Foundation supports the development of young professionals by funding a graduate degree. The fellowship supports those who have answered the call to become leaders in public service and policy. Gustavus nominates up to four student leaders and a national committee selects and interviews finalists based on their responses on several essays and a policy statement. The Foundation also provides assistance with career counseling, internship placement, graduate school admissions and professional development.

Critical Language Award

The Critical Language Scholarship (CLS) Program is a U.S. government effort to expand the number of Americans studying and mastering critical foreign languages. A scholarship fully-funds intensive language instruction and structured cultural enrichment experiences in countries essential to America's engagement with the world. Applicants must explain their interest in and future application of the critical language. The selected critical languages are: Arabic, Azerbaijani, Bangla, Chinese, Hindi, Indonesian, Japanese, Korean, Persian, Portuguese, Punjabi, Russian, Swahili, Turkish, and Urdu.

The Udall scholarship honors the legacies of Morris and Stewart Udall, whose political careers had a positive impact on the stewardship of public lands and natural resources, and Native American self-governance and health care. The scholarship recognizes sophomores and juniors who excel in leadership, public service, and commitment to the environment or Native American nations. Gustavus nominates up to four students based on their leadership and commitment to environmental issues. The Foundation awards 55 scholarships nationally based on applicants' responses to several essays and a public speech or piece of legislation made by the Udalls. The awardees also participate in a weeklong conference with current and past Udall scholars.

Dr. Thomas Rossing established The Rossing Fund for Physics Education Endowment which is administered by the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA) for students at ELCA-related colleges or universities. The scholarship awards outstanding sophomore or junior physics students that are nominated by the Gustavus Physics Department. Selection is made by a national committee based on the applicants' personal and research statements.

DAAD-Rise Scholarship

The German Academic Exchange Service's (DAAD) RISE (Research Internships in Science and Engineering) program offers undergraduate students the opportunity to complete a summer research internship at one of Germany's top universities and research institutions. The program's mission is to "promote student exchange to Germany in the fields of natural science, engineering, and life sciences, and to motivate undergraduate students to learn more about Germany's research landscape and study opportunities."

Boren Award

The Boren Scholarship, an initiative of the National Security Education Program, provides funding for U.S. undergraduates to study less commonly taught languages in regions critical to U.S. interests. Boren Scholars represent a vital pool of highly motivated individuals who wish to work in the federal national security arena. In exchange for funding, Boren Scholars commit to working in the federal government for at least one year after graduation.

National Science Foundation Graduate Research Fellowship

The National Science Foundation (NSF) Graduate Research Fellowship Program (GRFP) helps ensure the vitality of the human resource base of science and engineering in the United States and reinforces its diversity.
