Professor of Philosophy and Environmental Studies and Hanson-Peterson Chair of Liberal Studies, Deane Curtin, received the 2014 Faculty Scholarly Achievement Award on May 3, 2014 at the College's Honors Day Convocation. Curtin retired from Gustavus in 2015.

Award recipients are nominated for this honor by fellow faculty members based on professional accomplishments regarding research activities in private, public, or corporate settings; presentations at scholarly meetings or conferences; and exhibits or performances.

Curtin holds a bachelor's degree from Hamline University, along with a master's degree and doctorate from the University of Iowa. His scholarship and teaching focus on international ethics, particularly the ethics of community development, and environmental ethics. These interests are reflected in his two most recent books: *Environmental Ethics for a Postcolonial World* (2005) and *Chinnagounder's Challenge* (1999).

While on sabbatical in Dharamsala, India during 2012 - 2013, Curtin coordinated a project with the Library of Tibetan Works and Archives to translate the major works of Western philosophy into Tibetan for the first time. He is currently at work on a book that examines what a moral life might look like if not ordered by the concepts of good and evil. Both of these projects were supported by a Fulbright-Nehru Fellowship.

Curtin has delivered addresses at major international conferences, including a keynote address at the First International Congress for Sustainable Development at Cesar Vallejo University in Peru, Tel Aviv University at the inaugural Conference for the Tarnesby Chair in the College of Medicine, Banaras Hindu University in Varanasi, India, and as the keynote speaker for the Greater Philadelphia Philosophy Consortium annual meeting.

During his career, he served as a visiting professor at several universities around the world: Kansai Gaidai University in Japan, Kings College, Cambridge University, the Harvard Center for Italian Renaissance Studies in Fiesole, Italy, and the Centre for Research on a New International Economic Order in Chennai, India.

At Gustavus, in addition to the Hanson-Peterson Chair of Liberal Studies, Curtin served as the Raymond and Florence Sponberg Chair of Ethics. He designed and led the Community Development in India program in addition to having led student programs in Japan, India, Spain, Italy and Morocco.

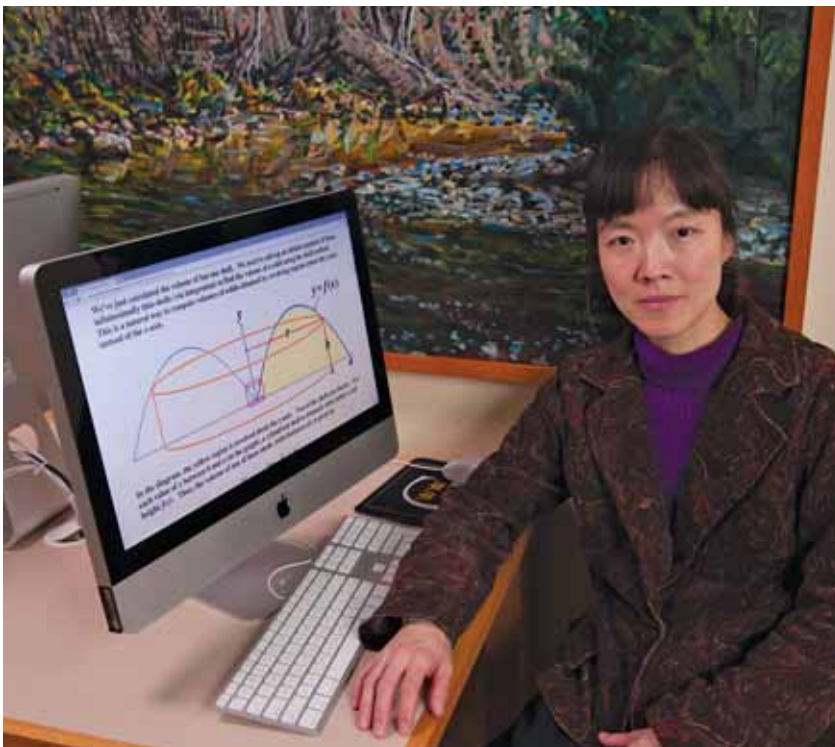

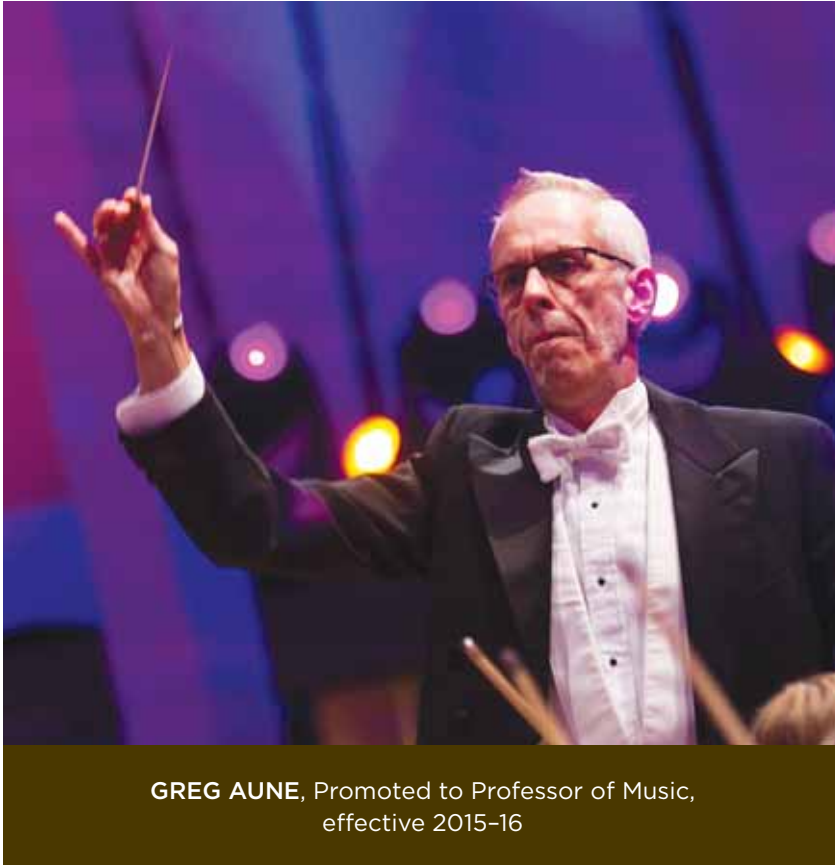
Heldke has frequently been invited to give keynotes and other lectures at various conferences and symposia. She was also a principal speaker at the University of Iowa's Food For Thought Symposium, where she presented a talk titled, "We're All Parasites: Eating, Guts and Fundamental Philosophical Categories."

At Gustavus, Heldke is the founder and coordinator of the Kitchen Cabinet, an advisory committee to the College's dining service. She served as the College's Sponberg Chair in Ethics from 2006-2012 and received a Gustavus Presidential Faculty-Student Collaboration Grant in 2014.

One faculty colleague who nominated Heldke for the award said, "Lisa Heldke is an internationally recognized leader in the burgeoning area of philosophy of food...she has been invited to address audiences in Uppsala, Taiwan, and Hamburg, as well as throughout the United States. She has published her own work widely as well as helping to organize the entire field through her work as an editor.

First awarded in 1986, the Faculty Scholarly Achievement Award was reestablished in 2004 and is now announced during the annual Honors Day Convocation.

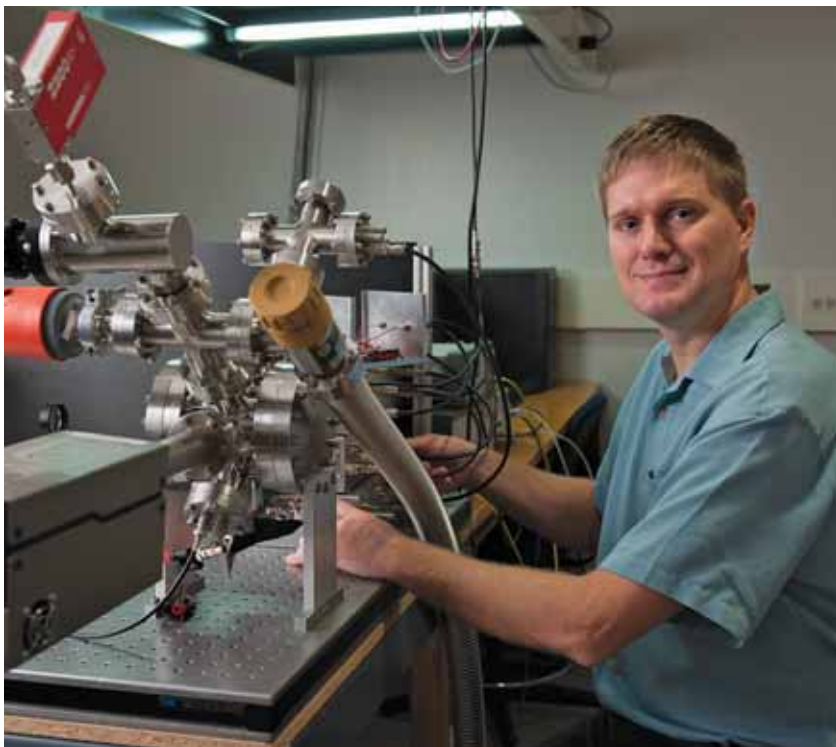
