Day 1 January 24 - Wednesday

Depart Minneapolis via scheduled air service to Stockholm, Sweden

Day 2 January 25 - Thursday Stockholm (D)

Arrive in Stockholm

Meet your MCI Tour Manager who will assist the group to awaiting chartered motorcoach for an orientation tour of the city including Gamla Stan

Transfer to hotel for check-in

Evening Welcome Dinner

Overnight at Hotel Radisson Blu Royal Viking

Stockholm's good looks and fashion sense could almost be intimidating. But this city is an accessible beauty, as easy to explore as it is to love. Though spread across 14 islands, connected by 57 bridges, it is compact and walkable. Each neighbourhood has a distinct character, yet they're so close together you can easily spend time in several areas. In each, you'll find trend-setting design, inventive cuisine, unbeatable museums, great shopping, pretty parks and loads of atmosphere

Day 3 January 26 - Friday Stockholm (B)

Breakfast at the hotel

Morning guided tour of the Royal Palace of Stockholm. His Majesty the King's official residence and also the setting for most of the monarchy's official receptions. The palace is a daily place of work for The King and Queen as well as for the various departments that make up the Royal Court. The palace is built in baroque style by the architect Nicodemus Tessin and is formed as a Roman palace. The palace has more than 600 rooms divided between seven floors with a state apartment facing the city and smaller living rooms facing the inner courtyard.

This afternoon visit the Vasa Ship Museum. The Vasa is the only preserved seventeenth-century ship in the world which is considered to be a unique art treasure. Continue to the Nobel Museum which contains all essential information about the most prestigious academic prize in the world, Alfred Nobel, and the Nobel Laureates

Day 5 January 28 - Sunday Stockholm / Uppsala (B)

Travel to the city of Uppsala, a temporal and spiritual center of power. A city tour of Uppsala includes visiting Museum Gustavianum, where you will see Uppsala University's collections, ranging from mummies, Vikings swords, art, instruments and other objects. Also visit the Botanical garden "Botan" and the Carolina Rediviva library, one of the oldest research libraries in the Scandinavian countries

Drenched in history but never stifled by the past, Uppsala has the party vibe of a university town to balance out its large number of important buildings and general atmosphere of weighty cultural significance. It's a terrific combination, and one that makes the town both fun and functional, not to mention very rewarding for the interested traveler

Day 6 January 29 - Monday Uppsala / Borlange / Falun (B,D)

Travel to Borlange to visit the Jussi Bjorling Museum. Bjorling is one of the leading tenors of all time, and an extensive exhibition presents the world-famous tenor from Borlange

An unlikely combination of industrial and adorable, Falun is home to the region's most important copper mine and, as a consequence, the source of the deep-red paint that renders Swedish country houses so uniformly appealing. It's the main city of Dalarna, putting it within easy striking distance of some of Sweden's best attractions, and the town itself is a pretty place to roam

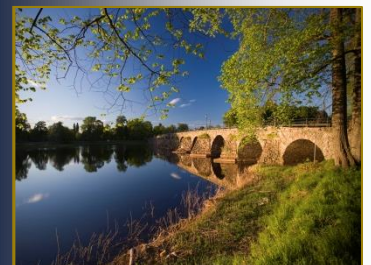
Morning visit to Falun Mine to experience a thrilling encounter with Sweden's history in the mine's mighty halls and winding galleries (220 feet deep)

A venerable old market town, Växjö, in Kronobergs län, is an important stop for Americans seeking their Swedish roots. Karl Oscar Days commemorates the mass 19th-century emigration from the area, and the Swedish-American of the year is chosen during the festival.

Morning excursion to Maleras where you will be able to see glass production processes, visit crystal and jewelry shops and walk around the Exhibition Hall to see the latest art glass pieces

Day 10 February 2 - Friday Växjö / Gothenburg / Oslo (B,D)

Transfer to Oslo via Gothenburg, the second largest city in Sweden

Attend Gustavus Wind Orchestra Concert in Jakob Church
Evening dinner
Overnight at Thon Hotel Opera

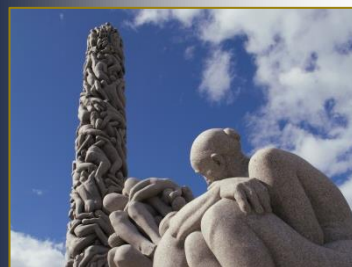
Day 11 February 3 - Saturday Oslo (B)

Breakfast at the hotel
City sightseeing tour of Oslo includes a visit to the Kon-Tiki Museum. Here you can experience original vessels and up-to-date exhibits on Heyerdahl's expeditions, including Kon-Tiki, Ra, Tigris, Easter Island, Fatu-Hiva, Túcume, Galapagos, and a 30-metre cave tour
Visit the Gustav Vigeland Sculpture Park

Day 12 February 4 - Sunday Oslo / Voss (B,D)

Transfer to Voss. Your journey will take you through the dramatic scenery of Norway as you pass mountains and fjords

There are few places you can get so many experiences springing from nature and culture as in Voss. Voss is situated between Norway's most famous fjords, the majestic and breathtaking Hardanger and Sognefjords, and is a natural starting point for exploring Fjord Norway

Enjoy one of the most popular tours of Norway - "Norway in a nutshell"; We will start the tour with the drive to Gudvangen where you will take the boat tour to Flam. During the boat ride you will explore the Aurlandsfjord and the Naeroyfjord, the narrowest part of the Sognefjord. We continue the trip by taking the famous Flam Railway heading from Flam to Myrdal. During the one hour ride you will see one of the most picturesque mountain sceneries Norway has to offer: panoramic views of beautiful mountains and breathtaking waterfalls

Afternoon visit to Trolldhaugen, home of composer Edvard Grieg. E. Grieg lived here for 22 years and composed many of his best-known works. It is now a living museum comprising an exhibition center with shop and cafe, concert hall, composers' cabin and Grieg's villa dating from 1885

Surrounded by seven hills and seven fjords, Bergen is an utterly beguiling city. The beautiful UNESCO World Heritage-listed Bergen is its centerpiece, and nature, be that mountains, fjords or sea, is never far away. But you'll also discover a dynamic cultural life, one a city 10 times its size would be proud of. Dive into its booming local food and coffee scene, fascinating art collections and excellent music

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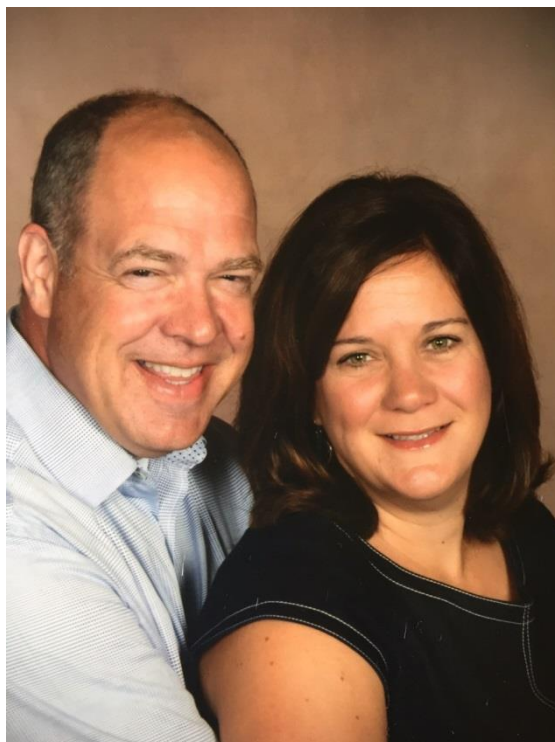
