Welcome to the Celebration of Creative Inquiry! This annual event showcases the research, scholarship, and creative work of Gustavus Adolphus College students. The Celebration of Creative Inquiry is a campuswide forum at which Gustavus students present their creative inquiry in a poster session or oral presentation. Creative Inquiry is an intentionally broad term that encompasses research and scholarship in all academic disciplines, which may be initiated as part of a class assignment or project, by the student or group of students, from experiences on or off campus, or by the faculty member as a collaboration with students.

The intent of creative inquiry varies by discipline but includes: asking a question that has not been asked before; a process that attempts to fill a gap or create new knowledge, information, or art; a process or product that requires the student to add ideas or imagination of their own; a project that is shaped by choices that the student made independently; and a component of critical reflection. This year, the event showcases student work conducted in 17 departments and programs. In addition, seven students will be presenting what they learned from their internships.

We hope you enjoy hearing more about about the creative inquiry our undergraduate students engage in every day at Gustavus, and that you will gain insights from projects in disciplines other than your own. As you will see, these kinds of projects provoke the intellect and stimulate the learning process—the heart of a true liberal arts education.
