**Job Summary**

A mentor is an honest, trustworthy, and curious individual who is ready to engage with high school-age students who share this curiosity. A mentor will collaborate with others to lead games, small groups, and facilitate spaces for community building, reflection, and laughter. A mentor will listen and ask deep questions. Mentors must be an advocate of the camp values of Christ-centered formation, vocation, wonder, collaboration, and justice. Nightly worship is a valuable part of the camp routine. Each night, a different mentor will be invited to share a testimony/sermon as part of their leadership. Gustavus Adolphus College is a Lutheran, ELCA-affiliated school, and this camp seeks to align values and principles with the ELCA, while also keeping our doors open to all different expressions of faith.

**Duties & Responsibilities**

- Participate in the full camp leadership training (June 11-19th, 2026).
- Build authentic and meaningful relationships with students, senior fellows, mentors, and the leadership team.
- Collaborate with other mentors and senior fellows to organize and lead small and large group activities.
- Encourage curiosity, wonder, engagement, and integrated learning.
- Seek to support each individual in feeling comfortable expressing their faith and having space to ask questions.
- Supervise students and support their well-being.
- Be on time and prepared for the day's events and activities.
- Be a positive role model of integrity for students and peers.
- Participate in daily mentor meetings using the time to listen and support one another.
- Follow all rules, policies, and practices of Gustavus and Faith, Science, and the Ethics Camp Code of Conduct.

**Required Qualifications**

- A Gustavus student in good standing with the college.
- Strong interest in faith and science, with demonstrated appreciation for the collaboration of faith and science to address the ethical issues of our time.

- Strong relationship building capacity, with demonstrated experience with middle and high school age students.
- Good listening skills and proven responsibility.
