




Q2 What is your ethnicity (as you define it)?





orientation?





Q6 What sex were you assigned at birth, meaning on your original birth certificate?










Q15 If yes, how useful did you think the training was?

Q21 When the person had sexual contact with you by using or threatening you with physical force, which of the following happened? Please check all that apply.









Q24 Just prior to the incident/any of the incidents, had you voluntarily been taking or using any drugs other than alcohol?



Q25 Just prior to the incident/any of the incidents, had you been given a drug without yourknowledge or consent?






Q29 What was the gender of the individual who did this to you?

Q42 a. If YES: How many women told you this?


