




## Q2 What is your ethnicity (as you define it)?




Q3 What is your race (as you define it)?




## Q5 What is your current status?

# Q6 What sex were you assigned at birth, meaning on your original birth certificate?





## Q13 Have you received training or education about the prevention of sexual assault?



## Q17 Since August 1, 2014, has anyone attempted but not succeeded in having sexual contact with you by using or threatening to use physical force against you?








## Q20 When the person had sexual contact with you by using or threatening you with physical force, which of the following happened? Please check all that apply.











# Q23 Just prior to the incident/any of the incidents, had you voluntarily been taking or using any drugs other than alcohol?



# Q38 Since the start of the current academic year, I have observed a situation that I believe was, or could have led to, a sexual assault.




